2002-08 Jeep Liberty Bucket Installation



Step 1. Driver & Passenger Bottoms/DB&PB: All the parts of the seat cover are marked on the inside right. Use the Seat Cover Part ID chart to identify the different parts. Place the seat covers on with the long hook Velcro[™] to the front.



Step 2. Driver & Passenger Bottoms/DB&PB: Tuck the back edge in, but don't connect the Velcro[™] just yet. Line up the seams of the seat cover to the seams of the seat, they should match closely.



Step 3. Driver & Passenger Bottoms/DB&PB: Route the long hook Velcro[™] under the front of the seat and press them to the carpet on the back edge of the seat as shown, avoid the seat slide mechanisms.



Step 4. Driver & Passenger Bottoms/DB&PB: Slide the outside edge Velcro[™] between the seat and the plastic cowling. Folding it in half lengthwise into itself will stiffen it up and help it not catch the seat.



Step 5. Driver & Passenger Bottoms/DB&PB: Push the seat cushion in to see where to feed the Velcro[™] through.



Step 6. Driver & Passenger Top/DT&PT: Likewise on the inside edge Velcro[™] next to the park brake, slide it between the plastic and the seat.



Step 7. Driver & Passenger Top/DT&PT: Pull the rear edge of the cover back hard, then press the side Velcro[™] to the carpet forming an "X" as shown. Lastly, pull the rear part back and press it to the carpet on the back of the seat bottom.



Step 8. Driver & Passenger Top/DT&PT: Slide the cover on with the extending hook Velcro[™] to the front. Note , it will be very tight going on, but will relax once pulled all the way down.



Step 9. Driver & Passenger Top/DT&PT: Same as Step 2, align the seams of the seat cover to the seams of the seat, they should match closely.



Step 11. Lid/L: Place the lid cover on with the lid down, and the letter "L" to the back. Connect the Velcro[™] under the lid as shown. re-tighten as needed for best fit.



Step 10. Driver & Passenger Top/DT&PT: Work the fabric of the seat cover to the middle of the seat, helping the material lay nice around the corners.



Congratulations, you're done!!!!! Once put into place, they'll give you several years of use, no matter how hard you are on them.
